Curriculum Intent

- To ensure every child has the ability to communicate through the written word, understanding the need for legible handwriting and presentation.
- To equip children with a knowledge of different text types and genres, which they can apply to their writing, not only in English but across the curriculum.
- To teach age and ability appropriate spellings and grammar rules that are applied to their writing and that build on prior learning.

Our aim at Holly Primary is to develop oracy and reading skills which filter through into every aspect of the children's written work. We want them to be exposed to and understand the differences between written and spoken language and to write as writers, with an eye to audience and purpose. Through the powerful and well-prepared teaching of phonics, grammar and spelling the children will become confident and competent writers. They will develop an understanding of different text types and genres which enrich and support their written work across the curriculum.

Curriculum Design

We teach children a knowledge rich curriculum that is ambitious and designed to build in knowledge content as children progress through school. We place great emphasis on the teaching of writing through phonics, handwriting, grammar and genre. The children understand the cross curricular application of the range of writing styles that are modelled.
